Connect Pro-Start

The electric airhorn + Pro-Start +power plug should be stored to the right of the tack room door

Connect the power plug to the receptable hanging over the RC boat instrument panel. Clamp the horn to the roof.

When it's properly connected to power you'll hear a short beep.

Check for the correct Starting Sequence

The Pro-Start should be permanently set to the 5 Minute Rolling Start sequence. Confirm this by pressing the **SEQUENCE SELECT** button once and counting the beeps - this indicates which of six starting sequences is selected. **You should hear 5 beeps followed by five more beeps.** If you hear something else, please ask the PRO to reprogram the unit. **If only one race is to be started, disconnect the Pro-Start right after the starting horn.** Otherwise the Pro-Start will continue looping through 5-minute starts.

Warn Racers that the Start Sequence is about to get underway


Push the **Manual Horn** button a few times to alert sailors that the sequence is about to start. Note: using the **Manual Horn** during a sequence does not affect the sequence.

Start the Sequence


Start the sequence by pressing the **SEQUENCE START** button. There will be a fifteen second wait before the first horn sounds. Beeps help the Race Committee know when a horn sound is coming. A long beep occurs 15 seconds before every horn sounding. There will also be a 5-4-3-2-1 beep countdown before every horn sounding. The beeper will sound at the minute marks where there is no horn.

If Something Goes Wrong

You can postpone the start at any time up until the actual start of the race, using the flag shown and two horns. When you end the postponement with one horn, be ready to start the sequence exactly one minute later.

MARCH 3RD BOARD MEETING

- Several leaks have been repaired, involving leaking heads. Discussions are advancing with the City over reducing a recent \$4176 water bill caused by these leaks. The Water Dept. is monitoring our water usage and reworking our bill.

- The board decided to contact the Wooden Boat Club in an attempt to reinstate a lapsed Open House tradition of having their beautiful old wooden power boats visit the club and take people for rides during
